Re: AO-LEC-18-001: Reconsideration of New Voter Letters

You asked for a formal advisory opinion from the Legislative Ethics Committee (Committee) to reconsider prior advice of the Committee. You asked that the Committee revisit its treatment of the new voter letters. After thoughtful consideration and debate, the Committee respectfully declines.
